

What is a limerick?

A limerick is a silly poem with five lines, three long lines and two short lines. The long lines are the first, second, and fifth lines while the short lines are the third and fourth lines. A limerick follows the rhyming pattern of AABBA, which means the long lines will rhyme with each other and have the same rhythm, and the short lines will rhyme with each other and have the same rhythm.


My "Frog on a Log in a Bog" story is a limerick. See what I mean:

There once was a big, green frog. His home was in a blue bog. With a flip and a flop, He took one big hop, Then he sat on his big, brown log.






